NATURAL ACTION WINE CLUB – A ONE OF A KIND WINE CLUB WORKING TO EMPOWER BLACK, INDIGENOUS, AND PEOPLE OF COLOR (BIPOC) - LAUNCHING SPRING 2021

LOS ANGELES (December, 2020) – A diverse group of professionals across wine, hospitality, fine arts, and education have come together to launch <u>Natural Action Wine Club</u> (NAWC). The one-of-a-kind natural wine club is focused on providing exposure, education, access, and opportunities for the BIPOC community within the wine industry and beyond.

NAWC (a 501(c)3 non-profit organization) was born as a response to the calls for greater inclusion and opportunity for the BIPOC community in the oft exclusionary world of wine - and also an answer to the need for a broader awareness and appreciation of African American history, art, culture, contribution and achievement. Through partnering with winemakers, wine professionals, and educational institutions, the club's mission is to aid in providing direct channels of support and resources that offer BIPOC increased and sustained entry points into the world of wine - all while providing club members with a dynamic and enriching experience.

NAWC is a quarterly subscription service offering its members exclusive wines from a rotating cast of California-based natural winemakers that meet the criteria for ethically farmed, low intervention wine – and who also have made a commitment to implementing programs that embody the club's mission. Participating winemakers included in the inaugural shipment are: Amplify Wines (Santa Maria, CA), Good Boy Wines (Los Angeles, CA), Scar of the Sea (San Luis Obispo, CA), and Solminer Wines (Los Olivos, CA) – with additional wineries to be announced with following shipments.

Through a partnership with <u>The Kinsey African American Art & History Collection</u> and Foundation – one of the largest private collections of African American fine art and primary source artifacts in the world – Natural Action's wine labels will be uniquely adorned with fine art and historical imagery from the collection, along with corresponding collectible art and educational assets. NAWC will also spotlight emerging BIPOC artists across various mediums.

The founders of NAWC commented in a shared statement, "We came together to launch this initiative with a collective desire to help foster equity and representation in the wine industry. Our varied backgrounds and experiences give us a multi-perspective understanding of the steps that are necessary to improve access and inclusivity in the wine community at large. Natural Action is our small piece of the puzzle."

Additionally, NAWC is partnering with Cal Poly's undergraduate wine and viticulture program – the country's largest – and their newly formed BIPOC Scholarship for Wine and Viticulture through the California Community Foundation. A portion of NAWC's proceeds will go towards financial support, mentorship and internship opportunities for BIPOC students interested in pursuing careers in wine.

"We are grateful for Natural Action Wine Club's support of the Cal Poly scholarship for BIPOC students in wine and viticulture through the California Community Foundation. Their support will open doors and create opportunities for students of color pursuing a career in the wine industry," commented Allyson Dela Cruz, Director of Development at Cal Poly's College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences.

As it progresses, NAWC looks to implement a variety of initiatives that include internal internship programs, wine exposure and educational events, exhibitions, and more.

Natural Action Wine Club is now taking membership subscriptions via <u>NaturalAction.org</u> and will be shipping its first wine delivery in Spring 2021.

About Cal Poly's BIPOC Scholarship for Wine and Viticulture:

As the largest undergraduate wine and viticulture program in the country with 300 students, Cal Poly has a unique opportunity and responsibility to recruit a more diverse student body, leading to more diversity in the wine industry in the future. It is hoped that this scholarship fund will be a tool to attract the attention of high-achieving BIPOC students who may not be aware of the exciting career opportunities the wine industry offers. The scholarship will be available to any Black, Indigenous, People of Color student in Cal Poly's College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences who expresses an interest in a career in the wine industry. Students majoring in wine and viticulture will be given preference. This scholarship program will not only provide financial support to students of color but will also provide mentorship and internship opportunities to help set the student up for a successful career in the wine industry.

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
